RE: Non-Resident Issuance of Concealed Carry Permit

Dear Mr. Chapman:

Thank you for contacting this office in response to our request for clarification regarding eligibility and the issuance of a Utah concealed carry permit to non-residents. During our conversation you confirmed that an individual may apply for a non-resident concealed firearm permit despite the applicant not possessing a concealed carry permit from their resident state.

In consideration of this information, it has been determined that Utah's relevant statutory provisions are not compatible with Pennsylvania and we can no longer recognize statutory reciprocity with Utah. The Pennsylvania Attorney General's website will be updated to reflect that Pennsylvania and Utah no longer maintain statutory reciprocity; however, our site will indicate that a Pennsylvania resident may apply for a Utah non-resident permit.
